

## Pentecost Pinwheel

On Pentecost, the Holy Spirit appeared to the Apostles as tongues of fire and wind. By completing this craft, disciples will be reminded of these two symbols of the Holy Spirit.

This craft does not involve a pin, so it is safe for little children to enjoy playing with as well.

Supplies:

- A new pencil
- 3 inch pipe cleaner
- Paper pinwheel (the next page has 2 pinwheels available)
- Scissors
- Hole punch
- Glue (make sure the glue dries fast)

Instructions:

1. Cut out the paper pinwheel square. Cut the diagonal lines as well.
2. Glue the corners with the dots on them to the center of the pinwheel using a hole punch. Be careful not to crush the pinwheel while you work.
3. Punch one hole through the center of the pinwheel using the hole punch. Again, be careful not to crush the pinwheel.
4. Twist the pipe cleaner tightly around the pencil top.
5. Put the pipe cleaner through the pinwheel's center.
6. Wrap the end of the pipe cleaner around itself to make a ball, careful to leave space to allow the pinwheel to spin.
7. Attach the flying dove to one of the spokes of the wheel
8. Try out your new pinwheel in the breeze!
